Anand expecting tough fight

India's pride and world champion

India's pride and world champion Viswanathan Anand is confident about his chances when he takes on Bulgarian challenger Veselin Topalov in the World Chess Championship in April/ May next year.

"Tam preparing well for the 2010 World Championship. The matches should all be even and hardfought. Topalov is more aggressive than Vladimir Kramnik," he said on the sidelines of a corporate chess event organised by NIIT. "It is difficult to top 2007 and 2006 but 2009 was not terrible. My focus will be on the 2010 World Championship."

The championship was originally scheduled to be held in Chennal but was shifted to Sofia, Bulgaria. Asked if it mattered, Anand said: "I am ready to play anywhere. It is upto the world

The prize fund for the World Championship is two million euros. Regarding that he said: "Ihave no complaint. Even if the prize money is more, I will still have no complaint."


