PC Market

The overall India PC shipments for Q2 2013 stood at 3.53 million units, representing a substantial year-on-year growth of 24.0% over Q2 2012 and a quarter-on-quarter surge of about 30.2 % over Q1 2013. The overall India PC shipments for Q1

The overall India PC shipments for Q1 2013 stood at 2.71 million unites i.e. a year-on-year growth of roughly 3% over Q1 2012 and a quarter-on quarter growth of about 7.5 % over Q4 2012.

The branded desktops witnessed execution of a few large deals, primarily in BSFI, IT and Government sectors. The consumer market remained largely flat with a marginal quarter-on-quarter growth of 1.5 % noted over Q.4 2012.

Mobile Handsets

According to CMR's India Monthly Mobile Handsets Marker Review, April 2013, June 2013 release, India registered 73.5 million mobile handset shipments for the period January-April 2013, registering a growth of 11.1% yearon-year. During the same period, 9.4 million smartphones were shipped in the country, a growth of 16.73% on an annual basis.

According to Faiul Kawoosa, Lead Analyst, CAMR Telecons Parctice, the feature phones market in India has matured, whereas the smrtphones category is showing promising growth. This is attracting relatively new entrants such as Micromax and Karbona to start offering smartphones, particularly for entry level users who would like to migrate to a more sophisticated mobile experience.

Server

Though the worldwide server marker remains in a relatively week start, In India the marker has done well to an extent. It stood at \$707.4 million in 2012 and is forecast to reach \$982.3 million in 2017. HP, IBM, Fujitsu and HCL have a strong presence in the Indian server marketplace. This strong presence due to strong server unit shipments and the revenue generated through channel and direct sales across India.



The overall Server Market in India witnessed a growth of 10% year on year, with x86 being a key contributor of growth in terms of units in the market. In contrast, the Non-x86 market saw a decline of 55%.

Tablet

As consumers continue to drive the adoption of tablest, the market for mobile computing solutions has never been better. The rapid growth of Tablet has got mergional channel players to focus on this sector, with many unveiling mobility strategies and new business divisions. Tablet Po winessed a massive growth figure of 424%. The sales for 2012-13 stood at 1.9 million units as against 0.36 million units in 2011-12.

The dramatic surge stemmed mainly from the home segment, aided by steady expansion in the business sector. The main challenge that resellers face is identifying the right mobility and security solution for their customers, as the requirements for each business and differ greatly. Restllers need to work closely with technology vendors to be educated on the vast array of mobility solutions available and the specific benefits that they can bring for their customers.
