The NIT MindChampions Academy (MCA) is a joint initiative between NIT and Grand Master Viswanathan Anand. The main objective of this not-for-profit is to promote the game of chess amongst schoolchildren.

While chess is a part of everyday life in some parts of South India, there are still many students who would not get the chance to learn and play this game. We set up the such hoping to let everyone enjoy the benefits of chess. The most important of which is the role that chess plays in enhancing the logical, visual, memory, analytical and concentration skills of students."says Anand. Today the McA has helped over 1.5 million children in 16,600 schools across India learn the basics of playing chess. Transforming this learning into healthy competition, the organisation has also set up 15,000 tournaments in the last ten years.

Any Indian school is free to integrate the McA chess programme in their curriculum. Software training will be provided to teachers. Anand also personally pays a visit to various schools in order to motivate students to keep on playing and answer doubts.
