India has more than 1bn mobile users now

India's mobile phone subscriber base peaked to more than 1 billion users (100 crore) for the first time, data released by the telecom regulator on Wednesday showed, making India the only country after China to achieve that milestone.

"It is a matter of great pride for us. It shows an empowered India and an engaged India and a tech savvy India. It will mean more data, more government to government connectivity, more broadband. It

will give a further boost to Digital India," said communications and IT minister Ravi Shankar Prasad.

Total wireless subscribers in Asia's third-largest economy rose to more than 1 billion at the end of October from 996.7 million at Septemberend, the data showed. Mobile subscriptions in India have surged in recent years, helped by the launch of cheaper smartphones and record low call rates as a result of a cut throat competition among mobile phone operators to expand customer base.
