Public cloud services market will surpass \$326 million this year

The public cloud services market in India, a high-growth segment, is forecast to grow 32.4 per cent in 2012, totalling \$326.2 million.

By 2016, cloud computing services will become the largest single segment within the public cloud services market in India growing to \$140.8 million

This will account for about 14 per cent of the total public cloud services spending, according to a report by Gartner.

Worldwide public cloud services revenue is on pace to total \$111 billion this year, it

Software-as-a-service (SaaS) is the largest segment and is forecast to grow to \$115.6 million in 2012, while infrastructure-as-a-service



(IaaS) is expected to grow to \$42.7 million in 2012 from \$35.2 million in 2011.

Business process services or business-process-as-a-service (BPaaS), the next largest segment, is forecast to grow to \$112.1 million in 2012, up from \$90.3 million a year ago.

Growth in application infrastructure services or platform-as-a-service (PaaS) will also be high. The PaaS seg-

ment is forecast to grow to \$15.7 million in 2012.

The cloud management and security services segment — a new segment comprising cloud security services, IT operations management and storage management (including backup and recovery services) — is forecast to grow to \$40.1 million in 2012.

According to the information technology research and advisory firm, the global public cloud services revenue is on pace to total \$111 billion this year. High growth rates will occur in emerging markets — India, Indonesia and China.

However, 81 per cent of spending increases will come from North America and Western Europe.
