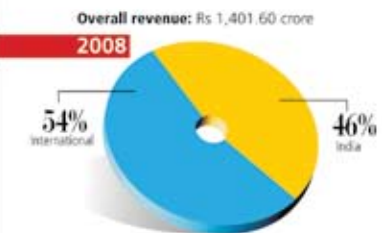
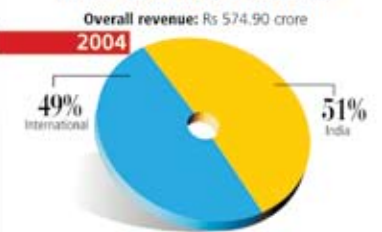

plus of 47 million in India in the working age group of 15-59. "We wanted to prepare this 47 million for the opportunity. We also realised that India had become a story of multi-sector growth. But, earlier, when industry leaders told us they needed an NIIT in their sector, we used to say we were too busy. During the time of global discontinuity in IT, we decided to build models for other sectors," says Pawar.

With that, the mission of NIIT, which was to build IT talent in developing countries during the first 20 years, changed to global talent development. As the company entered new areas, its net revenue more than doubled from Rs 450.7 crore in 2005-06 to Rs 1006.8 crore in 2007-08. In the same period, its profit after tax rose from Rs 40.1 crore to Rs 75.6 crore. The stock market has taken note. NIIT's market capitalisation is a long way off the dizzy heights it had once scaled — it is doubtful that any technology company will ever regain the levels of 1999-2000. However, the combined

Vijay K. Thadani did not know it then; it's only in retrospect that he sees January 4, 2000, as a great day. That was when the stock price of NIIT, the education company he started with his hostel mate from IIT Delhi, Rajendra S. Pawar, touched Rs 3,844 a share, translating into a market capitalisation of Rs 14,837.84 crore.

Those were the heady days of the technology boom, when untold millions chased the latest college-dropout-turned-garage-entrepreneur in the hope of funding the next Hewlett-Packard. As would happen with a boom funded by such money — Pawar, the NIIT chairman, calls it "dumb money" — it soon gave way to the mother of all meltdowns. Nearly 40 per cent of the crowded IT education market vanished. As the sector continued to flounder, NIIT's market capitalisation plummeted to Rs 332 crore on September 21, 2001.

Pawar, who insists on a clean desk before he starts work, took the team to the drawing board and drew up a plan to do what he knew NIIT should have done years earlier but could not because of the frenetic 30-40 per cent growth of the 1980s and 1990s.

He inferred that the company had two core competencies. The first was to create learning material ("we do it better than most people in the world"), and the second education process management. These had been built over the first 20 years of NIIT's existence and had helped the company ride the first steep part of the 'S' curve, which, Pawar insists, is the course of all corporations that last 100 years or more.

Around that time, Pawar was involved in a study involving the demographic dividend (a concept that considers India's large population an asset). The study projected a shortage of 40 million skilled professionals in the developed world and a sur-

market capitalisation of NIIT and its software arm, NIIT Technologies, which was spun off as a separate company in August 2004, has clawed its way back to Rs 2,126.35 crore as of a week ago.

"The key focus for NIIT is pedagogy. Instead of building expertise in content, it is building expertise in learning systems and methodologies. Instead of saying, 'we will train people to programme', it is going a step down and saying, 'how can people learn what they want to learn'. This is the right path," says the IT sector analyst with a Mumbai-based research house who does not want to be named because he is not formally tracking NIIT.

Moving up

Senthil Pandi Chinnasamy passed out of Erode Sengunthar Engineering College, Erode, last year, only to realise that there were no jobs for him in spite of his four-year degree in electronics communication. In the summer of last year, he enrolled into a six-month course of NIIT, during which he worked on two projects. "After finishing, I had five-six job offers," says Chinnasamy, currently working with 3i Infotech in Chennai.

NIIT Edgeiners, the course that altered the course of Chinnasamy's career, has also changed the perception of NIIT. Launched in April 2006, it is targeted at engineering graduates. Some, like Chinnasamy, join right after graduating; some others join for mid-career re-skilling. The company says as many as 100,000 engineers join in a year.

That is starkly different from how NIIT was perceived earlier: a place for those who could not hope to get into top-flight engineering colleges. Two IT services companies, one top-rung and the other middle-rung, told the strategist that they did not hire from NIIT.

Thadani disagrees, and points out that as many as 490 NIIT students found jobs with the top five IT companies in the country between April and August this year. He also points out another facet. "A good 25 per cent of IT professionals in the country have studied at NIIT at some point or the other. They may not join a top IT company immediately, but may be on their second or third jobs."

Smarajit Dey, who left BITS Pilani's faculty to join NIIT in 1990, is more philosophical. He patiently provides the social context. "Education must benefit in such a way that the students, whatever they were before, become more capable and perhaps get the economic benefit of that. Some people will get 90 per cent in class, and some 50. To believe that I will have one programme to accommodate all is simplification. Those who can get into a premier engineering college, will. For some, their capabilities are at a point that NIIT becomes the best option."

In the 1970s, you were either in the top half a per cent of the population, which joined the top engineering colleges, or you were cast away and told to get into general education without the promise of employment. "NIIT gave a second chance at a technology career to those people who the conventional education system, restricted in terms of numbers, had declared unfit. If you see NIIT in this context, you will realise its social context," says Dey.

Dey, as president in charge of new initiatives, widened the context on the lines of the plan drawn up during the days of the trough. "If you look at the organisation, it has shown the tenacity to handle a situation which many organisations gave up as lost. We regrouped and fought back," says Thadani.

Uncharted territories

This tenacity, among other things, impressed ICICI Bank enough to become NIIT's partner in setting up the Institute of Finance, Banking and Insurance, or IFBI. When K Ramkumar, the group human resources head of the bank, called Pawar one afternoon in November 2006, they had met just once, fleetingly, at a cricket match. The bank was facing a problem of manpower supply and NIIT was looking to diversify. In February 2007, they met, and the IFBI brand was launched two months later. "How many people would have moved like that? It was a wonderful experience, trusting, not contractual," says Ramkumar.

ICICI Bank, which holds about 19 per cent equity in the venture, prepared the curriculum and promised to absorb everyone who passed out of the institute in the first year. That is down to 60 per cent as other banks like HDFC Bank, Kotak Mahindra, Vijaya, and so on, have come forward to recruit.



"A fresher takes 9-12 months to become functionally independent. In that period, the customer experience suffers. These kids coming out of IFBI are not productive on the first day, but certainly after the first month," says Ramkumar.

In the year and a half since inception, IFBI has placed 7,500 people in the financial services industry. "The same person is walking through our door, but does not have the aptitude to be an IT professional. Instead of saying, 'sorry, we can't do anything', we asked ourselves, 'how do we skill ourselves to impart new skills'. Walk into any ICICI Bank and it will have an NIIT-trained personnel," says Thadani.

On the same lines, Genpact, a leader in business process outsourcing, joined hands with NIIT to announce the Institute of Process Excellence to address the increasing demand for skilled workers in the sector. The new company, announced in June this year, will initially offer training programmes in areas such as business processes, language skills and business communication, and intends to add additional offerings in other areas including finance and accounting, banking, insurance and supply chain.

A third initiative, NIIT Imperia, has taken the company into the relatively rarefied group of institutes imparting executive management education, which is meant for those already working. Launched in September 2006 in association with the Indian Institutes of Management at Ahmedabad, Kolkata and Indore, Imperia has gone on to forge partnerships with IIM Lucknow, Indian Institute of Foreign Trade and IMT Ghaziabad.

Generally, executives are wary of such programmes because they require them to leave their jobs, forgo the salary for the duration of the course, relocate, and renounce family commitments. Imperia demands none of these. It uses synchronous learning technology, which sets up remote classrooms connected to a central studio, typically located inside one of the partner institutes. Classes are conducted by faculty members teaching from the studio connected to students distributed over several centres. Each student can interact with every other.

Just like the brick and mortar model, this classroom is faculty-led and faculty-controlled. A student can raise his hand by clicking on an icon to seek the teacher's permission to speak. To replicate the action of a teacher calling a student to the blackboard to illustrate something, the Imperia teacher can hand over the control to a student. "The challenge is to replicate everything done in a class and yet do away with the geographical limitations. The fundamental difference is in the ability to use the best of faculty and institutes irrespective of your location and at timings convenient to you," says Dey.

However, new teaching content is one part of the new mission of global talent development. To address the other part — global — NIIT has spread out. Having recently gone into Africa, the company for the first time disclosed the revenue from the continent last quarter, which turned out to be a sizeable 7 per cent of the total. Two acquisitions, one of Cognitive Arts and the other of Element K, met its need for a footprint in the US.

"Element K has the second-largest training library in the world... The margin is set to improve as NIIT turns around the operations of Element K, and as it leverages on Element K's content library to beyond US. We expect margins to double in the next three years from 6 per cent to 12 per cent," said a recent Macquarie Research report.

The new NIIT, believes Pawar, is ready to start its climb on the second steep part of the 'S' curve. "I have to keep repeating 'global talent development' for a few years before everybody gets it," says Pawar. And then perhaps the chaps who influence market capitalisation also will. 📌

IN A shift from the usual vote-grabbing practices, some enterprising political leaders are taking the lead not just in helping the youth in their constituencies become employable but also in getting them employed.

Be it Union commerce minister Kamal Nath setting up a development and learning centre (DLC) for students in Chhindwara, Union finance minister P Chidambaram's son Karti Chidambaram organising a job mela in the FM's constituency, Sivaganga, or Raj Thackeray's Maharashtra Navnirman Sena's retail training programme for the youth, they all depict a change from the beaten path. Whatever be the trigger, it augurs well for the youth in these regions as companies are coming forward to lend a helping hand.

Sample this: Last year, DLC was launched at Chhindwara in collaboration with NIIT. The commerce minister not only convinced top IT companies to be a part of it but also helped them get land and buildings. Today, there are over 20 companies that have a presence in the region including Intel, NIIT Technologies, Cisco, TCS, IBM, Infosys, Dell, Suzlon and HCL. The first batch of 60 students have already graduated while another 320 are studying there.

THE DLC provides intensive professional training programmes, which include an English preparatory school for the students, along with IT training modules. "I am happy to see industry come forward for nurturing the inherent talent base in rural India," says a visibly excited Nāth. "NIIT's model DLC in Chhindwara will go a long way in inducting our youth into the mainstream industry."

Similarly, finance minister Chidambaram's constituency, Sivaganga, has seen an initiative to connect village youth with potential employers. Early this year, son Karti Chidambaram, also an All-India Congress Committee (AICC) member, invited TeamLease, a temporary employment firm, to his father's constituency in Tamil Nadu to organise a job fair for the educated unemployed. The fair, Job Mela, initially helped recruit around 500 people. Subsequently, more such fairs were held at Sivaganga.

In Maharashtra, the Maharashtra Navnirman Sena, often in the news for the wrong reasons, struck the right chord recently. Sniffing an opportunity in the retail sector, the party, led by Raj Thackeray, has launched a drive to train unemployed youth through his Navnirman Academy of Retail Industries a few months ago. The party which fights for rights of 'Marathi Manush' has welcomed youngsters who have been residents of the state for over 15 years.

Initiatives such as these, feel many, will help prepare India for the future. NIIT chairman Rajendra Pawar estimates that by 2020 India will have a surplus working population of about 46 million while, developed countries will have a shortfall of 56 million because of their ageing population. "These jobs however, will only come to India if the workforce is educated and skilled," he says. "So, though there is a massive opportunity at the macro level, at the industry level there is an acute shortage. Chhindwara sets the tone in this regard."

Such initiatives demonstrate the ability to attract potential employers and corporates. In the case of Chhindwara for instance, Cisco and Intel set up labs within the DLC. Cisco announced a state-of-the-art networking learning facility in May this year. The lab has been designed to showcase advanced collaborative technologies such as Cisco TelePresence. It's a pilot project in a larger collaborative initiative by Cisco, the government and industry players for rural transformation, using technology as an enabler. As part of a pilot project to enable Chhindwara's transformation to a connected model district and promote entrepreneurship among the youth there, Cisco actively mentored a group of students at the DLC at Chhindwara over the last six months. It also plans to fund some students' business ideas.

Wired classrooms could be the next big thing

Today's classrooms are increasingly available through several channels — the TV set, internet, or a centre in a remote location which links to a prestigious institute — thanks to companies looking at long-term investments to turn education into a profitable, high-growth business.

Tata Communications is looking to cash in on the online tuition space and plans to build an online platform for individual teachers. Mukul Sood, head, content business, Tata Communications, says: "We currently provide training for corporate clients and Tata Group institutes. We plan to tap individual teachers for providing online tuitions, especially for competitive exams, as this is a huge market in India."

The company intends to introduce an IT platform wherein, for every 2-hour class, the teacher would be required to pay approximately Rs 1,500. "The teacher has to use Tata Communication's broadband connection and teach online

as many students as he would want to. Tata could do the student fee collection too on behalf of the teacher," adds Sood.

According to a CLSA Asia Pacific Markets report, the e-learning market is projected to grow to around Rs 1,100 crore by 2012 from 145 crore currently. Besides, online modules cost one-tenth that of a regular course.

The worldwide market for online tutoring is estimated to be in the region of Rs 46,800 crore. India now earns around Rs 60 crore per year from online tutoring or 10 per cent of the total market share, notes the CLSA report.

Everonn Systems India, a Chennai-based leading education and training company, has signed an agreement with Indian Institute of Management Indore (IIM-I) to offer management programmes through

VSAT technology. The courses are expected to benefit working executives as well as self-employed graduates and are offered through Everonn's education centres. As part of the

arrangement, two programmes will be launched immediately, and more programmes will follow, notes Pawan Kumar Singh, director, IIM-I.

NIIT Imperia is also introducing virtual classrooms

connected 'live' to teachers in management institutes. For the September 2008 cycle, it will introduce programmes offered in conjunction with management institutes like Indian Institute of Management Calcutta (IIM-C), Indian Institute of Management, Lucknow (IIM-L) and Indian Institute of Management, Indore (IIM-I). ness management and financial management. In 18 months, over 2,500 professionals have studied at NIIT Imperia.

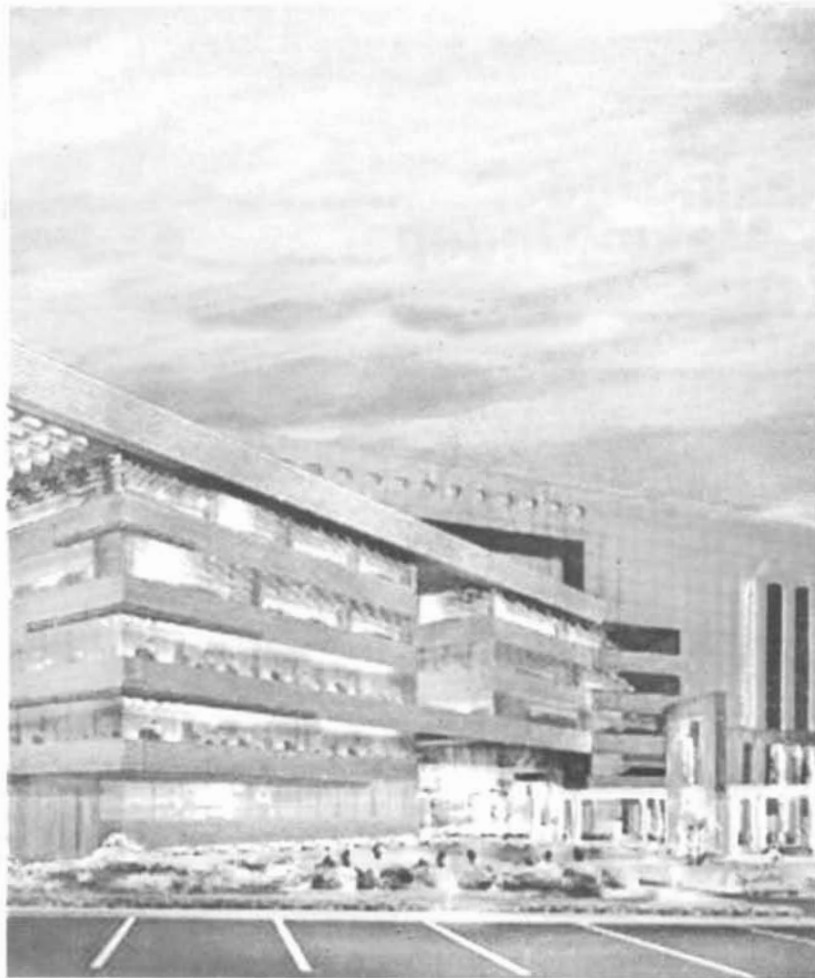

Deputy Chief Minister Sushil Kumar Modi said this while flagging off the ICT @ School project at Mahant Hanuman Saran High School, here on Friday. "The Gujarat government has already implemented it. The Bihar Government plans to do the same," he added.

The ICT@ project has been initiated by the Department of HRD, Govern-



ment of Bihar to impart computer education in the High and Higher Secondary schools in the state. NIIT has partnered with Bihar State Electronics Development Corporation (BELTRON) to implement this project, while the Bihar e-Governance Services and Technologies (BeST) are the consultants to Government of Bihar for this project.

MANAGING ideas may be as challenging as a business. And a lucrative one too. Little wonder then, India Inc has devised a way to do just that—encourage 'intrapreneurs' or employees who have ideas that could potentially become a venture in itself. They would focus on ideas that could be implemented on a large scale with support from organisations or get the initial funding to check the commercial feasibility.

In many cases, these intrapreneurs end up steering those projects and ventures. The catch, though, is the idea has to be strategically aligned with the interest of the company. Some companies bitten by the intrapreneurship bug include Adobe, NIIT, KPMG, Pepsi and Microsoft.

Adobe, for instance, launched the incuba-

tion programme for its Indian employees three years back. This was following the success of its global seed programme. Under the programme, employees generate ideas which are then sifted through various channels and finally recommended by a committee for innovation', set up specifically for the purpose. Once it's approved, these ideas get the support from Adobe's global expert pool for further development. "Creative ideas can come from anywhere and that calls for a robust system to nurture and develop those into something noteworthy," says Adobe CEO Naresh Chand Gupta. Apart from initial funding of \$1 million, the idea initiator also gets a 6-12 months window to work on it. If it succeeds, it's scaled up and the person behind it ends up heading the entire project or venture. The programme is already yielding results. In the last three years, the IT major's Indian arm filed 60 and 25% of the

patents filed by Adobe worldwide last year came from India alone.

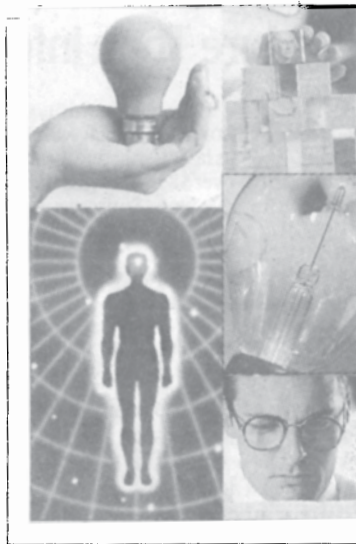

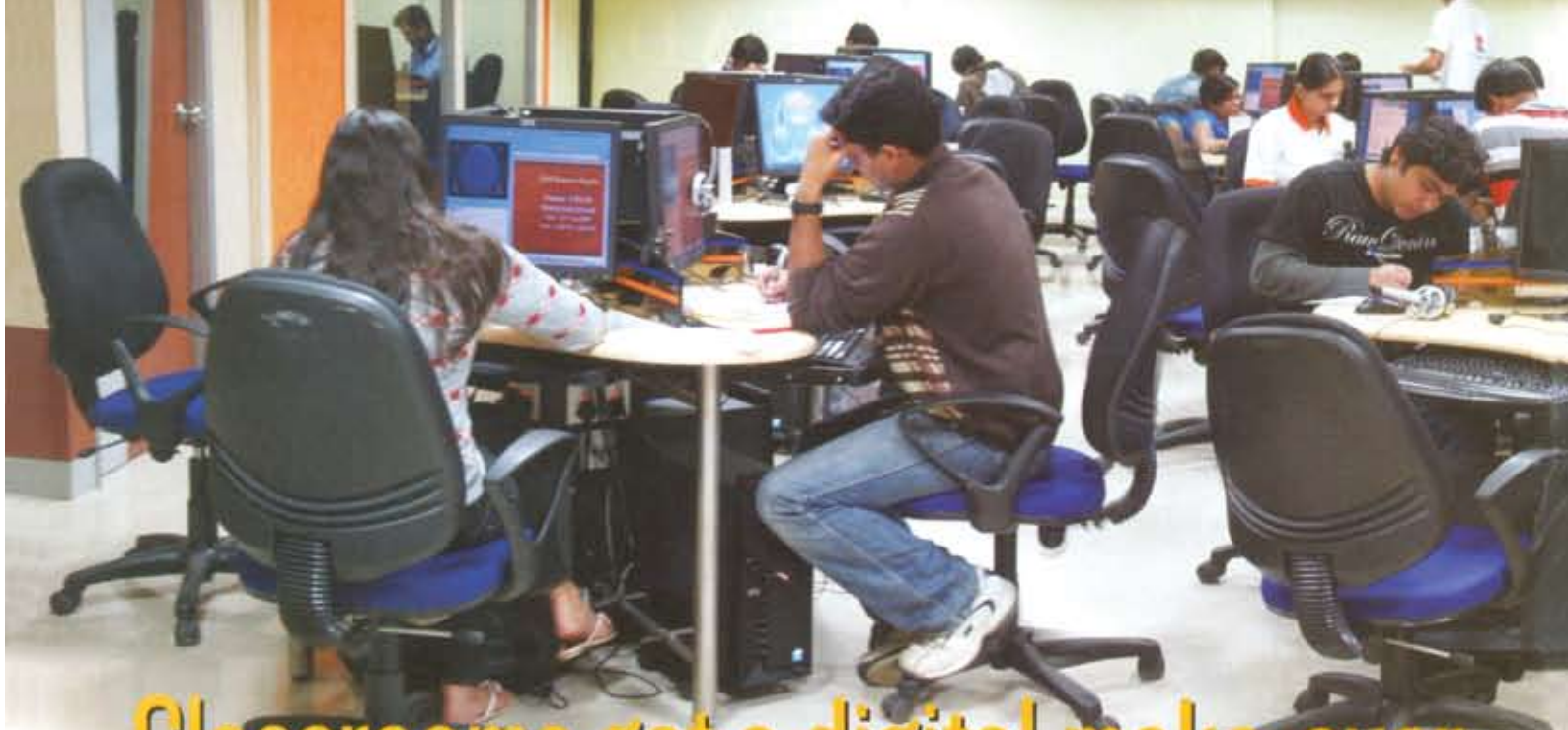

For Agilent Technologies, All Ideas Matter (AIM) works on the same logic. Launched four years back only to get reintroduced on a larger scale two years later. AIM has received

an enormous response. Out of the 730 ideas posted on the website last year, specifically designed for the purpose, 37 required funding. In the last four years, 50 ideas have been funded and around 40 individuals are heading their respective projects. So much so, one of the ideas floated a-year-and-a-half back is a global project today. Its success in the domestic market led its global foray, says Agilent quality head Sushmita Narayan. "It was getting difficult to manage ideas and this seemed the right way to channelise them. Besides, such an initiative sends out a message to youngsters that we care about what they say."

In the consultancy business, such incubation programmes drive growth. In fact, KPMG's latest offering in HR domain—Human Capital Solutions division—was a result of the same, which the ideator now himself heads. "For us, constant innovation and identifying newer areas of business is imperative, be it a new service line, market or industry for survival," says Human Capital Practice partner and head Ganesh Shermom. shreya.biswas@timesgroup.com



Classrooms get a digital make-over

After changing the way we work and play, technology is now changing the way we learn

Deepi Gulati is halfway through IIM-Indore's Executive Program in Applied Management. The course, conducted on weekends, helps her juggle her education and her career as a finance professional at the Bangalore office of Thomson Reuters. Every day, Deepi settles down in her chair for the three-hour evening class.

Higher learning

However, this is not the usual evening class. For starters, only about a dozen of her classmates actually sit in the same room in Bangalore as her. The rest are spread across the country, in similar classrooms in different cities. The teacher too, is usually sitting hundreds of miles away in Indore or Delhi. However, like a normal classroom, she can 'see' the teacher and the teacher can 'see' her. She can even interrupt the teacher's lecture by 'raising her hand', through a mouse click.

"I might have considered joining a full-time MBA course," says the 26-year-old, "But for personal reasons,

I cannot be away from my job. I can't take a break. Of course, it's tough to get into an IIM."

Welcome to the classroom of the future. At NIIT's Imperia 'classroom', ace professors can teach literally hundreds or even thousands of students at the same time, whether they are sitting in Delhi, Mumbai, Guwahati or Patna.

"Learning happens because of many factors: because of what the instructors say, because of the questions students ask and because of the interaction between the students themselves," says Udai Singh, executive VP at NIIT and the man in charge of Imperia, its 'virtual classrooms' initiative.

Udai's design of the 22 Imperia classrooms reflects this belief. Each student has a computer with a webcam. Unlike the classical e-learning, where interaction tends to be more one-sided due to the broadcast mode or recorded programming; here, the students and the teacher are joined together by a 1.2 Mbps video link.

"Everyone wants to learn from an

expert. Good instructors motivate and encourage you to learn. At the same time, we realized that such inspirational teachers are always in short supply. They are not able to reach out to as many students as they would like to," Udai explains.

NIIT, which started operating such classrooms a year-and-a-half ago, is of course not alone. It was the US-based communications provider Hughes Network Systems that pioneered the concept of virtual classrooms in India, in 2002. Starting with just 128 students for a virtual classroom course from IIM-Kozhikode, Hughes now has 3,500 students at its 120 franchisees across the country, doing a variety of courses from IIT Delhi and Bombay, IIM Calcutta and XLRI, among others.

Another strong player that also offers courses from the IIMs and IITs, is the Chennai-based Everonn Systems. Everonn, which has most of its live classroom network in its partner schools and colleges, has around 400 learning centers in the country.
